Retrieving Freedom's main objective is to place Service Dogs with Veterans with disabilities and Children with Autism. While all dogs in our program are initially trained with one of these placements in mind, we do identify certain dogs that are not suited for Service work due to medical or behavioral concerns.

I understand and accept responsibility, financial investment, and care required of owning a released dog. All household members will respect the basic needs of the dog for a proper diet, shelter, veterinary care, exercise, attention, and rest. If at any time, I, or other members of the household cannot meet the requirements of proper care, I understand the dog is to be returned to Retrieving Freedom.

Due to the increase in cases nationwide, the demand for released dogs outweighs the supply. Not everyone that applies will be able to receive a released dog, and Retrieving Freedom will place dogs to the best of the ability and with applicants who show most opportunity to give the dog the best environment possible.

If at anytime during the process, a Retrieving Freedom representative determines any of the household members to be unsuitable to continue with the placement of a released dog, Retrieving Freedom will exercise its right to withdraw the application and/or released dog without monetary reimbursement to any party.

Every dog that has entered the Retrieving Freedom Training program has been cared for and trained with the heights of standards. This includes the selection of high-quality puppies from our breeding program along with other outside breeders, complete veterinary care, and basic training. While Retrieving Freedom strives to produce highly trained and qualified Service Dogs, we still incur many expenses with the dogs that are not selected to continue with training. The adoption cost to the general population is set at \$1,000. As you will be receiving goods and services from Retrieving Freedom, Inc. in the transfer of a released dog, the amount given will not be tax deductible donation.

Applications are only good for ONE Calendar year. Once your application has been received, a member from the Retrieving Freedom team will be in contact with you and provide more information on steps moving forward.
